Dear Residents,

On Tuesday, May 15th, Jericho residents will be asked to go to the polls and vote on the Jericho Public Library budget for the fiscal year 2012/2013. Our goal in preparing this budget was to keep costs down (under 2%) while increasing and improving services to the Jericho community.

Historically, the Jericho community has always valued education and libraries. The community has given the library the opportunity to provide quality resources and services and the means to adapt to new technologies. Patrons may borrow a Kindle Fire, Nook Color, Sony Reader, Nook Tablet or iPad and have a variety of choices for an eBook downloadable title. Downloadable services have been increased with two new downloadable options, *Freeding* and *Overdrive Advantage*, which supply popular titles that are available only to Jericho patrons for transfer to their devices. Free music downloads are available with *Freegal*, an *iTunes* type of service. Photo quality pictures may be obtained by inserting the memory card from your digital camera or smartphone into the computers in our Information Center. There is a multipurpose fax/scanner/color printer available for patron use. A meeting room with video conferencing equipment which allows for interactive communication can be reserved by patrons. Downloading our *Card Star App* will allow your smartphone to act as your library card. Most recently we have installed a state-of-the-art self-checkout system to provide a more efficient experience at the Circulation Desk. Circulation staff is always available to provide assistance.

We have added *Transparent Language Online* with *BYKI*, a database with over 80 language choices including ESL, for language instruction. Homework help is available with a real tutor via the JPL website. Also, all patrons may sign up for continuing education courses with our *Universal Class* option. Our new Home Bound Service is flourishing. Technology aides are on hand (after school hours) to offer you assistance with downloading questions. Our free Museum Pass Service continues to be popular.

People of all ages may continue to enjoy entertaining films. This fiscal year we have upgraded to professional grade theater equipment with a newly installed movie projection screen, microphone and professional spotlight, all to make performances at the JPL a memorable experience. In addition, the community may come together for meetings, lectures and programs and to make use of our three available community room spaces.

The budget increase this year is 1.91% which comes to less than \$10 a year for the average Jericho household. We have made every effort to minimize the increase while maintaining and improving the present level of service. Your continued support on May 15th will help us provide the excellence you've come to expect. Please come out and vote and then come to the Jericho Library and enjoy your tax dollars at work.

**Sunday, June 10th at 2:00 PM**

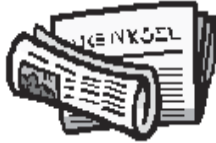
